Annual Meeting Ewell Free Library Association April 30, 2018

Library Manager Rebecca Moe's 2017 Annual Report was presented in written form, highlighting the many varied programs offered with very good attendance. New programs include Chess and Board Games, and a very well-received "Share a Story with Sadie" (a therapy dog). Ms. Moe is justifiably very proud of the Library's new Teen/Young Adult Area, which includes café seating with chargers and plugs for laptops. She reports we will be receiving additional funding from Senator Patrick Gallivan this year. Also, the Library will maintain the same opening/closing schedule as this past year year-round, notably all Fridays being closed and all Saturdays open, as the Saturday circulation was up by 18%.

Trustee William Chapman was nominated for another five-year term ending in 2023. (J. Craft, S. Sabers) Hearing no other nominations, the secretary was instructed to cast one ballot for Mr. Chapman.

As there was no other business to be conducted, a motion to adjourn was made at 7:22PM and carried (*J. Craft, C. Lehman*). Members then enjoyed refreshments graciously provided by Michele Greatbatch.
